Introduction. The main goal of a volunteer is to protect the rights and freedoms of a person, to support him both materially and psychologically, as well as to fulfill his civic duties.

Volunteering is usually understood as humanitarian activity, during which a person or a group performs a certain work - provides help, volunteer services, not for financial gain [1].

Aim. Consider volunteering as a tool to develop skills and to promote welfare or improve the quality of human life, to unite the nation, and to resist under conditions of worsening socio-political dangers. In addition, it is designed to establish contacts for possible employment.

Materials and methods. Using analysis and synthesis, observation and comparison in his work. Specific volunteering is a type of work where people who volunteer for a specific task in the majority are chosen by the community or staff based on their skills and abilities.

Youth volunteering is when peers of those people who are targeted for help are involved in volunteering.

Results and discussion showed that volunteer organizations exist thanks to human resources, namely volunteers who are willing to voluntarily perform the necessary work. People are not always ready to take this step, so non-profit volunteer organizations must be prepared for a lack of volunteers; and do not always have the ability to successfully attract stable employees. Social reality shows that in non-profit organizations there is often a high turnover of personnel, which makes it almost impossible to solve the problems of voluntary charity.

The way out of such a situation can be seen in the promotion of moral values and the unity of the ethnic group. A person without established values does not always cope with difficulties and even with the performance of simple duties for an agreed fee. The probability of participation of an individual without humane values in volunteering decreases. The presence of meaningful life values is the basis that is necessary for the existence of a full-fledged society. They can become the main motivation of a person, the basis of volunteering. Leaders and representatives of volunteerism are obliged to constantly influence the support and development of such values in each of its subjects and objects.
