SPECIFICITY OF THE WORK OF SES UNITS IN NIKOPOL DISTRICT DURING THE WAR

Nikopol district is in a high-risk zone due to military actions, requiring quick adaptation to wartime conditions. SES units must respond rapidly to changing threats and perform their duties under challenging conditions. Units need to be ready for rapid relocation in case of military actions, developing mobile rescue groups for quick response. Use of modern technologies for coordination and communication between units in the absence of stable connections is important and even vital sometimes.

Talking about difficult and dangerous job, elimination of the effects of shelling and explosions, including rescue operations and evacuation of victims, neutralization of explosive objects and demining of territories take place even in very difficult and dangerous conditions.

Organizing the evacuation of the population from dangerous areas and providing first aid, conducting educational campaigns about actions in emergencies and safety during wartime must be paid special attention as well.

Close coordination with military units to ensure safety and effective threat response, cooperation with local authorities, medical services, and volunteer organizations to assist the population are important parts of every day routine.

Providing psychological support to rescuers and the population affected by military actions, conducting training on adaptation to wartime conditions and increasing stress resistance may seem to be not so vital but it is not correct as they are quite necessary in the work of professional SES units while ensuring units have the necessary equipment and resources to perform rescue operations and continuous updating and modernization of equipment to improve work efficiency during the war.

The work of the State Emergency Service (SES) units in Nikopol district during the war is characterized by a need for rapid adaptation and operational readiness. They face significant challenges due to the high-risk nature of their location and the ongoing military actions. Key areas of focus include maintaining mobility for quick response, utilizing modern technologies for communication, and effectively dealing with the consequences of hostilities such as shelling and explosions. Ensuring the safety of civilians is paramount, involving evacuation procedures and first aid provision, alongside educational campaigns on wartime safety. Close collaboration with military units and other services is essential for coordinated and effective threat response. Additionally, providing psychological support to both rescuers and affected civilians, and conducting training to enhance stress resilience, are crucial components of their operations. Continuous material and technical support, including the modernization of equipment, is necessary to maintain the efficiency and effectiveness of their rescue operations under the challenging conditions of war.
